INFORMATION, REFERRAL AND RELOCATION

The Information, Referral and Relocation (IR&R) Program provides information and referral functions designed to meet the challenges of the mobile military lifestyle. Individuals with unresolved information needs are referred to the source or resource that can best address those needs. The IR&R program oversees all relocation service functions to assist Marines and families with Permanent Change of Duty Station, both stateside and overseas, and provides Settling-In Services when they arrive on a new installation.

Contact your nearest Information & Referral specialist who can assist you in making valuable connections at your installation, which include all MCCS programs, sister service programs, and off-base resources.
